Anonymous	Mount Hawthorn	No	While we do not oppose the concept of the Hawkers Market we are concerned that its location on such a small park will create access problems for us with regard to traffic blocking the southern end of Axford Lane. For many of us who back onto Edinboro and Fairfield Streets, Axford Lane is the only vehicular access we have to our garages. The car park between Axford Lane and Axford Park is very small and is easily congested. We have already experienced delays in exiting Axford Lane at school pickup time when the food vans were arriving and setting up. This is an extra sensitive issue for us as we are regularly frustrated by delivery trucks that block Axford Lane while at Pisconeris and by builders/tradesmen who happily and repeatedly block the laneway several times a week for periods of 6-12 months when someone on the laneway is renovating or building. While builders are not likely to be blocking the laneway on Friday evenings they often leave building materials/equipment in the laneway for days at a time. Just two weekends ago a builder left his equipment trailer completely blocked the laneway over the weekend – because the laneway is open at both ends they do not see this as a problem. THIS WILL HOWEVER BE A SERIOUS PROBLEM FOR US IN CONGESTION OR ILLEGAL PARKIG ASSOCIATED WITH THE HAWKER'S MARKET ALSO CAUSES AXFORD LANE TO BE BLOCKED AT AXFORD PARK END – THIS WILL PREVENT US FROM DEPARTING OR ACCESSING OUR HOMES. Please also take into account that some of us live opposite the Mezz therefore parking at the front of our house is not always a viable alternative. Further exacerbating the problem, is the dogleg in Axford Lane which prevents drivers being able to see in advance if the lane is blocked, therefore you must drive halfway through to discover the blockage and then have to reverse all the way back, circle the block and re-enter the laneway from the other end (assuming that's not blocked). Even as I write, a pallet of pavers (for 2 weeks) and a load of sand (for 4 days) has been left in Axford Lane – while
