Throughout this year, the City has continued to strengthen our relationship with the local Elders with the continuation of the Boordiya (Bosses) Reference Group. We have a growing list of 57 Aboriginal businesses and employment numbers have reached three per cent.

We have continued our commitment to reconciliation, understanding and respect for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples with a specific focus on continuing to build relationships with Noongar Elders, businesses and the local community as well as ensuring further commitments to Aboriginal procurement and employment.

Truth Telling, the reviving of traditional names of parks and reserves, collaboration with neighbouring local governments and cultural awareness workshops for children have been highlighted as areas of importance for our Elders.
